Yes, we lost many friends and neighbors — some in the most tragic of ways — and yes, many of our longtime businesses and landmarks will never return, but as Julie again points out in this issue, in her capacity as FMB Community Foundation President, "we look forward to welcoming back our members as well as whoever will be the new faces of FMB who will bring excitement and new blood." Change is never easy and often painful, but change is something we cannot ignore nor wish away.

Do I long for the island life we loved on September 27, 2022 – you bet I do! Do I wish we could rebuild FMB into the same island paradise we reveled in prior to Ian – of course! Do I want to snap my fingers and have our community rebuilt tomorrow – naturally! Those, however, are not the cards that life dealt us. But do I believe that the best way to deal with all this tragedy

and destruction is by cheerily looking forward rather than depressingly looking back – without question!

And we are making progress, in steps large and small. Julie relates how she and husband Dave returned to their rebuilt island home in April and Deb did likewise a month or so ago; I myself will be back in my newly painted tangerine abode by the time you read this article. Businesses open and reopen every week, with the Bay Oaks Recreational Center and the Beach Elementary School doing so in November, and Margaritaville is right around the corner. While I wish these milestones could occur at warp speed, as the old saying goes, "slow and steady wins the race." So, if you read this and future editions of "Fort Myers Beach LIVING" and find it overly optimistic in attitude, then guilty as charged and "Mission Accomplished!"

### Julie & David Fite Love FMB

The life journey of Julie Fite began in LaPort, Indiana, where she lived until attending Indiana University in Bloomington. "After graduating, I worked for a year in Plymouth, Indiana, before packing up my car and moving to Aspen, as I loved skiing, so I spent most of the next 40 years in Colorado, including in Basalt and Glenwood Springs. During my first six months there, I blew through my limited savings so I bartended at the Holiday Inn at the Buttermilk Ski Resort where I met my husband. David. who was the Head of Maintenance. We married on August 8, 1987, at the Aspen Chapel with our reception at the Holiday Inn where we met, so that is a fun fact!"

Julie discovered FMB through her parents, who in 1980 rented on Palermo Circle until her Mother bought a Palermo Circle cinderblock cottage in 1994. "Immediately FMB became my happy place and it remains so to this day! I love water and wonder now how I stayed in landlocked Colorado for so long, but I was into skiing and Dave grew up there. Water is good for the soul and essential to the climate, while

FMB is so unique. I enjoyed the best of both worlds, between the mountains and beach, but the snow finally got to me, so when I retired from Special Olympics on March 30, 2020, we left for here the next day! That was when COVID-19 first struck, so other than a few truckers, we had the Interstate Highway System all to ourselves. We played the song 'Isle of Sanibel' by Crosby Stills & Nash and loudly sang, 'We'll never need an overcoat no more' when crossing the FMB bridge!"

Dave and Julie made FMB their new permanent home because when her parents passed away, they left their Palermo home to her and her three brothers. "Of us four. I had by far the greatest interest in FMB," Julie recollects, "so we bought them out in 2008. Over the next dozen years, we did some renovations, like removing trees and adding a swimming pool, and initially used it for weekends, vacations and holidays, though eventually my Special Olympics position allowed me to work remotely from Thanksgiving through the New Year, with Dave coming for a week or two here and there."





Julie's degrees in Therapeutic Recreation with a Psychology minor "made Special Olympics a perfect fit. I began with an internship in South Bend that sent athletes to Indiana State University for track-&-field meets, then picked it up again in Colorado, doing volunteer coaching and working in a sheltered workshop before becoming a six-county area Director and gradually taking on more counties and responsibilities. Special Olympics was a wonderful experience, working with those amazing athletes; seeing their progress and feeling their pride about their accomplishments, from walks through dashes up to events like 5Ks, as it was important that we had something for everyone. I met so many terrific and inspirational people!"

Today, Dave enjoys golf while Julie loves long walks, some bicycling, water aerobics, and being outdoors. "I am a voracious reader," she adds, "and a neighbor has a driveway pickleball court and that is great fun!" Principle among her Fort Myers Beach volunteer activities is being the FMB Community Foundation President. "This is a particularly challenging yet exciting time for the Community Foundation," she philosophizes. "Because of lan, the Community Foundation, like most everyone and everything else, must reor-

ganize and rebuild itself to best serve whatever will be the new FMB. Old programs and fundraisers may not return, while we start new traditions to replace them, so we are thinking outside the box. Volunteering for the community was important to me prior to lan, as I love FMB so much. It feels marvelous to give back, especially now after lan, when so many still need so much."

### Nuclear Bomb, Ukraine & Armageddon

When Ian threatened. Julie and Dave evacuated first to friends at Pelican Preserve, then to Gateway. "We lost power and cell service at Pelican Preserve and it did not come back until the next day, so we had little idea what was happening to the island. When coverage returned, our cells blew up with FMB news! A neighbor behind us sent a photograph showing the 9-foot storm surge covering the side of our house, up to the pool cage beam, and it made me sick. When I finally saw FMB. it looked like a nuclear bomb exploded or something you see on the news from Ukraine; it was what Armageddon must look like."

Their garage had nine feet of water, with seven feet filling their slightly elevated house. Despite this, Julie never thought about permanently leaving FMB, "as this is my happy place, though I did suffer from something akin to PTSD, but this is our home! Fortunately, Dave almost immediately began an owner remodel with great

friends, while we lived in our driveway in a RV loaned to us by a Colorado buddy. We stripped the house down to the studs, so we have new wiring, plumbing, windows, flooring, lighting and HVAC system, and moved back in on April 16. We feel so lucky to accomplish all this basically six months after lan, as so many others have it so much worse. I admit, however, that when Idalia approached in September, it rattled my nerves!"

Julie feels that their Palermo neighborhood "looks pretty darn good, considering we lost quite a few homes behind The Whale and 7/11 store, with both of those gone. I counted 13 lots where lan significantly damaged the homes or neighbors put them up for sale, but many are rebuilding. It is an old saying but, in lan's aftermath, it does take a village, as everyone helps out everyone else. We made many friends prior to the hurricane, but those bonds are now much stronger; before you waved or said 'hello' but now neighbors host barbeques or throw parties where everyone brings a dish to share. Ian in a weird way brought us all closer toaether!"

### We Will Persevere!

What does Julie think FMB will look like in five years? "We will have more 'Mc-Mansions' but I hope people explore 'Rebuild FMB Cottages' that have 15-foot elevations and are so cute with character. That is important so we do not become the next Bonita Beach

Road, where you know the Gulf is there but the homes are so huge and close that you cannot see the water."

It is however the people and not the architecture who make a community a "Happy Place," emphasizes Julie, "and I have no doubt that our citizens - those who remain and those who will ultimately call FMB home - will continue to make our island a 'Happy Place!' Our neighbors are open and accessible; they come from all walks of life and give us character with our share of characters and that is what makes FMB cool and eclectic, whether you are on the beach, going to a 'little black dress' event or a Pub Crawl and I love that! Life after Ian remains challenging but if we all work together and stay positive, we will persevere!" ■

Hurricane Ian changed the FMB land-scape in innumerable ways, including to the Fort Myers Beach Community Foundation (CF) that is evolving to best serve the island's new world. "We must rethink what we are and who we serve," explains Julie Fite, the CF President. "Some entities we formerly allocated funds to are not around now, nor are several longtime CF members, so our challenge is to morph into a Community Foundation to meet the island's present and future needs. The trick is to incorporate what we did well for so long while keeping all our ducks in a row!"

#### **New Challenges & New Answers**

"'The CF faces new challenges but finds new answers, like FMB," explains Julie. "For years, we were known for our Winter Concert Series but it is unlikely we can host those this season, so we must ask: 'Can concerts return or how do we replace those events and funds.' Conversely, children's author Abigail Griebelbauer is pledging 10% of the profits from her book, 'Winter Break at the Beach' that FMB inspired so that is new. Of course, the FMB Woman's Club is fantastic, collaborating with us in several capacities, like providing \$500 gift cards to FMB residents in lan's aftermath."

Julie cautions that "we do not know what a 'normal' fundraiser will be, so we are thinking outside the box. I had an epiphany, to reproduce the Town's colorful FMB logo onto a flag for sale! Another unique item will be a stylish bracelet with the CF's unique mission. These may be baby steps but each step forward is important."

Yet CF traditions endure: "We will participate with the Woman's Club in the annual 'Christmas Tree Auction' on December 8 & 9, then in early 2024 will sponsor a golf hole in the 'Putt-&-Pub Crawl' on January 20. We support beach cleanups, the Woman's Club's 'Passport Program,' Turtle Time, the Town's Marine & Environmental Resources Task Force, the FMB Public Library, Friends of Lovers Key, the Bay Oaks Recreational Center and FMB Art Association, as the CF rallies around the arts, education and preserving our local environment."

#### Come Join Us!

"The best way to learn about the CF," Julie urges, "is to attend a monthly meeting the third Wednesday of each month from October through April at the Mound House at 5:30 p.m.; just bring a dish to share and make new friends! We meet on November 15, then December 20. If you cannot attend, visit www.fmbcommunityfoundation. com and download an application."

When Julie was with Special Olympics, "we always thanked our volunteers but many replied, 'No – thank you' and now I understand why! When you help your community, you feel great; in fact, I often feel younger when I volunteer with the CF and that is a big personal benefit! With FMB starting over, there is an exciting time to join the CF; we are FMB's philanthropic lifeline and when you fulfill that goal, how can you lose?"

# Fabulous PhillyApple Pie

### **INGREDIENTS**

#### **Apple Pie**

- 1 9" unbaked pie shell
- 6 cups sliced baking apples
- 1-1/4 cup sugar
- ¾ tsp vanilla
- ¾ cup flour
- ¾ teaspoon cinnamon
- 6 oz Philadelphia Cream Cheese sliced thin
- 1/4 cup cold butter

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Preheat the oven to 400°
- Mix apples, ¾ cup sugar, ½ tsp vanilla, ¼ cup flour and ½ tsp cinnamon.
- Mound mix into pie shell.
- Layer the cream cheese slices over the apples.
- Mix ½ cup flour, ½ cup sugar, ¼ cup cold butter, ¼ tsp vanilla, and ¼ tsp cinnamon with a pastry blender until crumbly. Sprinkle over the cream cheese, covering it all.
- Bake pie for 10 minutes, then reduce heat to 350° and bake another 45 to 50 minutes until the apples are soft.
- Serves 6 to 8



# Town Hopes to Reopen Recreational Center in November

"The Bay Oaks Recreational Center is undergoing an extensive and complete remodeling following the devastation of Hurricane Ian," says Jeff Hauge, the Town of FMB's Director of Culture, Parks & Recreation. "We are targeting a November reopening, though the exact date is dependent upon the completion of the work. Patrons will immediately notice Bay Oaks' revamped gymnasium as well as the all-new fitness and cardio equipment, along with essentials like the new air-conditioning system. Bay Oaks guests will particularly like the new Nautilus equipment we actually ordered before lan but are just now installing. We hope to be ready to coincide with the planned mid-November reopening of the Beach Elementary School so the

kids can come to Bay Oaks for beforeand after-school programs as well as vacation day activities."

The Recreational Center remodel is so extensive, Jeff explains, "that people will think they are entering a brand-new building, as Ian allowed us to basically begin with a blank canvas! Everything will look new, with fresh paint and a new color scheme everywhere! The Bay Oaks remodeling is 'extensive and complete' for a simple reason: there was literally nothing to save after Ian! Eight to nine feet of water flooded the Recreational Center and we can tell, from the waves slushing all around, that it reached as high as ten feet in spots because of the rusting of our basketball court hoops!

Fortunately, the Recreational Center is solid concrete so is structurally sound, but it required expensive remediation for things like mold removal. We have one simple priority: to ensure it is as safe and clean as possible. This includes not only all new equipment but things like chairs, office furnishings, basketballs and exercise mats."

#### We Are All Ears!

Along with reopening the physical site, the Bay Oaks staff will initially implement limited programming for all ages. "Kids will enjoy basketball leagues and summer camps," Jeff relates, "with softball and wiffleball leagues for adults. Seniors will have volleyball, basketball leagues, step aerobics, senior softball, game days, and senior field trip and of course pickleball for adults and seniors, as pickleball is one of our most popular activities; so popular in fact that we have indoor and outdoor courts! Remember as well that Bay Oaks is ideal for social events like birthday parties and wedding receptions."

Jeff cautions that, program-wise, "we will start out slowly and implement a wider schedule as more residents and visitors return over the coming months. Even though we will begin with a limited schedule, much of the programming will be new and this is a tribute to our talented and imaginative staff, who care so much about this island and our children, residents and guests. While no one appreciates the creativity of our staff more than me, we realize we do not know everything, so if you have an event or program idea, please contact me directly at jhauge@fmbgov.com as we are happy to hear from you! The new Bay Oaks is full of potential and we need your help to maximize that potential, as there is no point in hosting events that do not appeal to you, so we are all ears! We cannot wait to reopen Bay Oaks, as another important milestone in the rebirth of Fort Myers Beach, and we look forward to seeing you again!" ■

# The Schmucker Family

Fort Myers Beach LIVING is catching up with some of our former Cover Story subjects, to learn what life is like for them "After Ian." This month we speak with Monica Schmucker, whose family we profiled in May 2022.


"lan wiped out 90% of our belongings including all three cars, and while the basic frame of our house remains, it is a total loss, so we must rebuild. Losing all our 'things' is not a big deal, as we can replace those. Our biggest loss is our community – all the island stores and bars and restaurants and the Woman's Club building and the Bay Oaks Little League field and the Beach Elementary School and our FMB way of life! That is the much greater damage to overcome than our personal stuff."

Monica, husband Dustin and young children Tessa Moon and Silas stayed on FMB during Ian, "but not in our home; we relocated to a much bigger and stronger house of friends on Virginia Avenue, near the DiamondHead Resort. Despite being newer and solid, it shook during the entire storm. Since it had hurricane windows, we watched Ian in all its fury. Silas made a fort underneath the coffee table with pillows all around, and I walked everywhere with the kids' lifejackets, just in case. Ian grew so intense that the sliding doors were bowing inward, so we stuck brooms and mops into the handle out of fear they would pop open! I really worried how long the house could hold up to the hurricane before the roof would fly off and the walls

collapse. Almost in a panic, I congregated everyone onto the middle floor for extra protection; just then, we saw the roof peel off the next-door house like a sardine can! It was really scary, especially with two little children."

Despite Ian, Monica and her family will rebuild their



As to what she learned from lan, "actually, my first lesson came from Irma in 2017," Monica relates! "We prepacked a suitcase full of priceless things to us, like important papers as well as our wedding photographs and the kids' baby books, so all we had to do was grab that and go. Even doing that, we lost so many more mementoes that now I will pack two suitcases! The second lesson is to evacuate even if it does not look to be a close call; normally a hurricane must come close to us to make that decision to evacuate and that margin just got wider for us. My third is that it is truly a nightmare to navigate all the resources you must access to recover from such a natural disaster; I cannot tell you how many times people said to me: 'Oh, you have insurance; then you are fine,' but they have No Idea how untrue that is!"
