"FMB is home and we are not going anywhere," expresses Bryan, before adding: "A few of our neighbors, however, are getting 'Hurricane Fatigue,' especially those with ground-level homes, and you can see the exhaustion on their faces."

Bryan could be talking about me! After Helene and Milton flooded my ground level home twice in eleven days, just days after the final items where completed from Ian, I reached my personal point of no return and recently listed my house for sale. Despite my love of FMB, its wonderful residents and terrific neighbors, and our marvelous businesses, I long for a sense of normalcy. I do not want to live in fear of every weather forecast from June through November. I do not want to start over again and again and again. I want to come home and not see my furniture stacked on the side of the street. I am tired of mops and buckets, squeegees and disinfectants. I want to live a simple life again, as the Salt Life has wore me out.

My breaking point, oddly enough, was neither the devastating Ian nor the monstrous Milton but the non-descript Helene. Despite never being closer to FMB than 300 miles away, with all of our local forecasters telling us time and again that this would not be another Ian, flood water surged through my home that evening. If this can happen from a hurricane hundreds of miles away, at what point will we soon see floods in conjunction with full moons and high tides or 'Sunny Day Floods," much less from our increasingly stronger and more frequent major hurricanes.

This is just me, though. Every single islander must make these personal decisions on their own. If you live in

an elevated home or just choose to rebuild for the second, third or fourth time, that's fantastic! If you are like me and feel like you must live on the other side of the bridge, I understand that, too. This isn't a game and there is no right or wrong answer; each of us will do what is right for each of us.

I may be moving but I'm not going far! The people whom I have gotten to know over the past 15 years are really great people and make up my "adult life" family!!!! I am so grateful for every day that I have lived on "the beach". I want to be able to spend a lot more of my days creating Art.

And "Fort Myers Beach LIVING Magazine" will continue, stronger than ever! We feel that this monthly magazine is an important thread in the lives of our beach community, made even more so since the storm. So, no worries, we're not going anywhere



Dawn & Bryan Thomas

"Bryan and I met at a college football game in Madison, Wisconsin," says Iowa City, Iowa native Dawn Thomas, about her husband, who was born in Roseville, Illinois. "I was living in Madison while Bryan resided in Champaign, Illinois. The game was the University of Illinois versus Wisconsin University, where my Dad, Barry Alvarez, was the athletic director and former head football coach. Meeting Bryan was most definitely not love at first sight, as it was one of those introductions where you say, 'it is nice to meet you,' then you move on."

For Bryan, however, Dawn stuck in his mind, though not romantically. "She was interesting, with a neat personality." Three years later, they reconnected but did not rush their relationship, as Dawn had kids in Wisconsin, while Bryan's children were in Illinois, so when they eventually began to date, it became an 8-year long-distance relationship. They finally wed on FMB in 2019, with just their four children – Joe, Danielle, Jake and Dylan – in attendance. "Joe in fact married us," says Dawn! Joe

lives in Newport Beach, Jake in Dallas, and Dylan and Danielle along with her husband, Kyle, all reside in Chicago.

Our Original Plan

While their relationship was not love at first sight, their FMB introduction was! "Our original plan was to own a Chicago brownstone while having a small Naples condo," Dawn recalls. "In September 2016 we began looking in Naples, then worked our way north to Bonita Springs and Sanibel. A realtor friend suggested FMB and once we came onto the island. we immediately loved it. We eventually found Palermo Circle, where we fell in love with a five-bedroom home and bought it that Thanksgiving, so now we have our big home here and a small Chicago condo. We completely flipped our original plan."

Bryan is the CEO of a third-party administrative company, CCMSI, based in Illinois, with offices in 33 states. "We manage casualty insurance claims for corporations, governmental entities, trade associa-

tions and public employers. I work from home or on the road. Interestingly, while the entire world wants to work remotely, I began doing so 29 years ago so I started the trend. I have terrific clients and I love what I do – I am extremely fortunate." Dawn retired as a Sales & Marketing Vice President for a Wisconsin Bank after 17 years, then ran her own FMB consulting firm, "but now I concentrate on community activities. I just finished my term on the Town's Public Safety Committee and am President of the FMB Woman's Club."

Three Hurricanes To Get Smarter

Bryan and Dawn were in Chicago when Hurricane Ian struck. "We had 10 feet of storm surge that wiped out our lower level that we already jokingly called our 'Hurricane Room,'" recollects Dawn. "Fortunately, we have an elevated home so water did not reach our 2nd and 3rd floors." "We were beyond fortunate," agrees Bryan. "We returned to FMB 10 days after Ian, and there are no words to accurately describe the condition of the island. Fortunately, we stayed at Dawn's parents' Naples condo until we regained power that November and completed our remodeling in February 2023."

Dawn and Bryan were on FMB for Helene, "as we returned for the Island Hopper Songwriter's Festival," she offers. "We moved what we could upstairs and elevated heavy things, like couches, as best we could on the lower level. We got five inches of water that ruined our baseboards but we hosed off everything else. By Milton, we were back in Chicago so we did not experience those 16 inches of flooding. Before we left, we moved everything, like the refrigerator and workout equipment, to the second floor, so that minimized our damage." "As we revamp after Milton, we will replace things like the lower-level drywall with cement, so all we have to do going forward is powerwash everything," Bryan explains. "It took us three hurricanes to get smarter but now we have a hurricane plan."

After three hurricanes, are Bryan and Dawn near "The Point of No Return?" "Not even close," raves Bryan. "FMB is home and we are not going anywhere. A few of our neighbors, however, are getting 'Hurricane Fatigue,' especially those with ground-level homes, and you can see the exhaustion on their faces. We love this island and its good people, but even we admit it can now be a challenge to live here, more so than when we first bought not that long ago. These storms are monsters, so we now have a better appreciation of why places like FMB are known as 'Barrier Islands!' As we continue FMB's rebuild, we must do a much better job in preparing for future hurricanes."

It's In Our Blood!

Dawn and Bryan love to travel and enjoy sports. Because of Dawn's Dad's background, football is important to them. "All our boys played football through college," she explains. "Joe and Jake for Wisconsin and Dylan for Illinois so we are actually a house divided. Now Jake is in the NFL and is the starting tight

end for the Dallas Cowboys, so we travel often to see him play. Weekends for us means football – it's in our blood! You can see all of our team flags flying proudly on our pool deck."

Volunteering is important to them. "I became an FMB Woman's Club member in 2018," Dawn says. "I joined to make new friends, but quickly became involved in the Club activities. With my marketing background, I was the Marketing Chair, became a Board member and in March 2023, President. There are so many great people in the Womans' Club and I am tremendously proud of that organization." Bryan recently became Chair of the Town's Audit Committee after 4 years as a member. "I can say without hesitation that even after three hurricane emergencies, the Town is in a strong financial position. Our Town Council and Town Manager, along with their staff of consummate professionals, do phenomenal jobs. I am very bullish on FMB's future."

What will that future look like in five years? "We will obviously have a lot of new development, but the fear that some have that we will become the next Miami or Naples is unfounded," Dawn predicts. "We may have more highrises and higher-end restaurants but this will forever be a flipflop community. I welcome our new growth; I really do!" "While Ian was a tragedy, community-wise it may actually help us in the long run," rationalizes Bryan. "We were looking a little ragged around the edges and probably needed a 25 to 30-year renovation plan. Ian forced us to now implement a 5 to 10-year one."

When Bryan and Dawn contemplate FMB, "the lifestyle stands out to me," he says. "My standard outfit is a V-neck, shorts and flipflops and if someone sees me in a polo shirt, they assume I have a meeting. We are a wonderful small resort town with little crime." "For me, it is the people," concludes Dawn. "Not only the islanders, but most of our visitors are terrific. There is an old saying that you want to be a florist delivery driver because everybody smiles when you show up and the same thing applies to living on a beach; everybody smiles! We are lucky that we found our own little slice of Paradise and that goes for our kids, too; whenever they visit, they always say, 'we hope you never move!"







"The Beach Kids Foundation (BKF) is a Non-Profit dedicated to assisting FMB children and their families," explains Bridgette Myers, who is a BKF Board Member & Past President. "We formed over 25 years ago with the mission to advance community development activities that support the kids of FMB through charitable, educational and civic activities. For the vast majority of our more than quarter-century existence, our primary venue to do so was through the Beach Elementary School, but since Hurricane Ian devastated the Beach School and now Helene and Milton forced the kids off-island once more, we are concentrating on individual children and their families outside of the school focus."

Like most FMB Non-Profits, the BKF is learning new ways to serve the community, emphasizes Bridgette. "Prior to COVID and the hurricanes, the BKF hosted an annual large-scale fundraising gala, 'The Spirit of The Holidays,' on the first weekend each December. Those were terrific, as not only did the community come together as one to celebrate the Christmas Season but we reliably raised roughly \$40,000 each year. Though we are not yet back to \$40,000 annually, we are doing well enough to continue to buy gifts for our island schoolchildren."

Bridgette reports that the BKF entry in the "2024 Christmas Tree Festival" theme is "Deck The Palms!" "This year we really wanted to incorporate the students of Beach Elementary and honor the island, so the students made ornaments that will adorn our tree along with shells collected by over five generations of families who stayed at the Red Coconut RV Resort. My family and I always shelled as a hobby and wanted to use some to make homemade ornaments for our Tree this year. While it is hard to part with these little treasures, knowing they will ultimately go towards fundraising to buy Christmas gifts for our Beach Kids is a decision well-made. We are so excited for everyone to see our Tree this year, as the work put in is truly an act of love for

our island and its children."

New Techniques


In years past, Bridgette reports, "the FMB Fire Department loaded up the toys on a big firetruck on Christmas Eve and along with Santa delivered them directly to the homes of all the 'Beach Kids'. Now, however, with kids and families spread out over a larger geographic area, we will host a pick-up event at the Liki Tiki BBQ Restaurant side room at 17650 San Carlos Boulevard on Tuesday, December 17, from 4 to 7 p.m. We hope the FMB Fire Department will again help us distribute the gifts and bring one of their firetrucks for the kids and their families to tour and photograph. The FMB firefighters are terrific BKF partners, and you cannot tell the BKF story without the FMB firefighters who deserve as much credit for our success as anyone."

- Fresh cranberries and rosemary sprigs (for garnish)


INSTRUCTIONS


