

"Beach Person" Ceel Spuhler!

Ceel Spuhler is originally from Boston, Massachusetts. "My father was a salesman so we moved around often when I was younger. We ended up in Northeast Ohio where I began college. I was just 16-years-old however, so my parents thought it best that I attend an all-girls school, so I went to Lake Erie College for Women in Painesville. That was a blessing, as we were near the Case School of Engineering that was an all-male school and those guys liked to date so that is how I met my future husband, Peter. He and I met on a blind date and it was love at first sight! Peter was good-looking, a hydraulic engineer, tall at 6'4", and a wonderful man! Our marriage lasted just over 50 years until his passing; Peter was the best thing that ever happened to me."

Peter and Ceel raised four children: Steven, Val, Ceel Junior, and Jim. Today, Ceel is the grandmother to Nick and his wife Sara as well as to Sam and his wife Leah, and great-grandmother to Sophie and Jackson. In Northeast Ohio, they

owned "P. A. Spuhler, Incorporated," a hydraulic engineering company. "I was the Inside Man and Peter was the Outside Man," laughs Ceel at the memory! "We sold hydraulic machinery for almost 25 years, until we relocated to FMB."

Unfortunately, Peter started to undergo health issues and he and Ceel thought that a warmer climate might benefit him. Ceel Junior already lived in Southwest Florida so they explored destinations close to her and "we found FMB," raves Ceel! "Back then. FMB was beautiful and not overdeveloped. We found the Creciente Condominium at the south end of the island, near Santini Marina Plaza, and loved it; I remained at Creciente until relocating from the island after Hurricane Ian, as it is just a jewel on FMB. It had a marvelous pool and Peter loved to swim - he was a swimmer straight through college and swam up north at the YMCA. Once we moved, he could swim year-round at the pool or in the Gulf, and that did wonders for his health, as did the sunshine as opposed to the gloomy Northeast Ohio

skies. I really believe that moving to FMB added years to Peter's life."

Beach People

When Ceel contemplates what she misses most about living on FMB, "certainly the sun and the beach, but what I miss the most are the people, especially in getting together with old friends. Everyone is so wonderful and unique. They come from all stages and walks of life, yet everyone calls FMB home. I discovered that after you live on FMB for a while, you become a 'Beach Person!' Beach People don't think about themselves but are always looking for ways to help their neighbors. I can't even begin to guess how many fundraisers the island community hosted for those in need, and of course everyone rallies around each other after our hurricanes and related flooding."

Ceel recalls lunching once a month with old friends from Ohio and they would say, "Ceel, you are now a different person; you have become a 'Beach Person,' and I understood what they meant. People who live on FMB are different because we live a different lifestyle than almost everyone else. I take immense pride in the title: 'Beach Person!'"

In addition to her island friends, Ceel misses her "morning walks along the beach as well as those after supper, and just staring at the Gulf. In fact, I formerly wore glasses but it seemed like my vision was improving so I went to the optometrist. He said that all that staring at the water improved my eyes, so today I am a 95-year-old who does not wear glasses!"

"The Rest is Literally History"

Ceel takes great pride in her efforts to preserve The Historic Mound House, the oldest standing structure on FMB that is now a museum and environmental education complex. "When we first relocated to FMB, I wanted to get involved in my new community, so I went to see the original Town Manager, Marsha Se-

gal-George. She explained that the Town was only a few years old and it wanted to preserve the Mound House but needed help in convincing the citizens that it was worthwhile. I joined forces with Betty Simpson and we gathered stories about the history of the Mound House, including speaking with former residents, and she and I became the first Mound House docents!"

The Town opened the Mound House for guided tours each Wednesday and Saturday, "with cookies and punch," continues Ceel. "We explained to residents that saving the Mound House would cost each beach household just \$12. In the late 1990s, the Town purchased the Mound House with grant dollars, and thank goodness we did, as the Mound House is a treasure! Finally, in 2019, the Mound House gained acceptance onto the National Register of Historic Places and that is an evening and reception that I will never forget! In addition to Betty and Marsha, Anita Cereceda and then-Assistant Town Manager John Gucciardo were essential to preserving the Mound House, as were many others who are too numerous to mention but too important to forget. Saving the Mound House was a joint effort by the entire community and the rest is literally history!"


In addition to her Mound House efforts, Ceel conducted tours of the former Seven Seas Cottage at Newton Beach Cottage, as well as contributing her time and talents to the FMB Public Library. She loves to do Crossword and word puzzles, along with reading. Finally, Ceel was the organizer of "The Supper Club," along with late FMB Mayor Dan Hughes. "Dan and I lost our spouses in the same year, so we wanted some format where people our ages could go out but not on a formal date, so we began 'The Supper Club' where six of us would go to dinner each Friday night. Before you knew it, the group ballooned up to roughly 20 people and restaurants would actually telephone me to be our host dinner location! Even though it was not to be a 'dating club,' three marriages came out of 'The Supper Club!' It was a lot of fun. After I lost Peter, my family and volunteer activities kept me going."

"A Small Town on a Large Beautiful Island"

Ceel contemplates what FMB will look like in five years: "It will certainly be a big change. FMB will always be beautiful, no matter what, as the beach and Gulf are gorgeous, but you will see many more high-rise condominiums and far fewer quaint

beach cottages, but bigger can still be beautiful. FMB will always be charming, as the 'Beach People' will not have it any other way; it will just be charming in a different way. For those of us who used to live on and miss the old FMB, we have our wonderful memories."

One new FMB development that Ceel looks forward to is the new Town Hall. "To me, the old Town Hall was like the island's 'Community Center!' I liked to arrive at Town Council Meetings and other community forums early, then would talk to people afterwards, and you got to hear all sides of the issues. FMB is a small town on a large beautiful island! I treasure FMB; I treasure it!"

SEPTEMBER

This month's highlight is the annual "Island Hopper Singer-Songwriter Festival" that "USA Today" ranked as the fourth-best "American Music Festival" in 2024! This year's event will be from September 19th through 28th, with the musical programs exclusively on FMB from Friday through Sunday, September 26th to 28th.

"You will not only enjoy some of the best musicians anywhere in the nation," Jacki says, "but they tell you the story behind the songs! The singer-songwriters will perform at venues all over the island and most of the shows are FREE; check out the entire schedule at www.lslandHopperFest.com. Look for special shows at The Historic Mound House, Margaritaville Beach Resort FMB, and Sunday's closing concert at the Pink Shell Beach Resort pool. Island Hopper organizers have announced that Chris Young will headline the closing concert at the Pink Shell Pool Party on September 28th."

After the "Island Hopper" concert concludes, "mosey on over to Bayside Veterans Park on FMB to keep the party going with the 'Bayside Park Concert Series' from 4 to 7 p.m.," encourag-



es Jacki. "Following the Bayside show, finish out your Sunday evening by sliding over to the nearby Lighthouse Resort 'Tiki Bar' for the Sunday evening Reggae show from 6 to 9 p.m."

OCTOBER

On Friday evening, October 24, the Margaritaville Beach Resort FMB will host the "Sand Ball," the official kickoff for November's signature program, "The American Sand Sculpting Championship." "The 'Sand Ball' is an evening of entertainment, beverages and light food," Jacki explains. "A highlight will be a magnificent 'satellite' sand sculpture, live sand sculpting demonstrations, entertainment and more. Margaritaville will be the first FMB location to have a satellite sand sculpture that will be up for viewing all through November. You will then see other satellite sculptures beginning to appear throughout November at various FMB locations leading up to the 'American Sand Sculpting Championship.'"

The FMB Community Foundation is clearly thinking Halloween, as it will host the "Haunted Carnival Pub Crawl" on Saturday, October 25, beginning at 6 p.m. Details are still coming together so check out www.fmbcommunityfoundation.com for updates as the event draws near.

While there are no formal FMB Halloween activities announced yet, Jacki expects "Halloween events all up and down the island, especially with Halloween on Friday this year. Check out the FMB Chamber website for details at www.fortmyersbeach.org."

NOVEMBER

The 35th "American Sand Sculpting Championship" returns to FMB from Thursday, November 20 through Monday, November 24, at the DiamondHead Beach Resort daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Championship features Master and Advanced Amateur Sand Sculptors from all over the world. The FMB Chamber, in partnership with the DiamondHead Beach Resort and The Sand Lovers, LLC, a leading name in the sand sculpting industry, are the Championship presenting sponsors.

"It is incredibly exciting to bring this beloved tradition back to FMB," raves Jacki! "This is one of the beach's signature events that everyone loves. FMB looks forward to this feel-good festival every year and many islanders bring their families and friends to this one-of-a-kind competition. Jacki explains that many of the Championship's traditional elements will return. "There will be sand sculpting demonstrations, 'Quick Sand' speed sculpting shows, hands-on sand sculpting lessons, a Kid's Zone, and the 'Sand Vendor Village.' 2025 FMB Hurricane Preparation

Get Ready Now!

After the last three years, few things inspire more trepidation for Southwest Floridians and FMB residents and businessowners than these two words: "Hurricane Season!"

The 2025 Hurricane Season is officially from June 1 through November 30, but the peak months for Southwest Florida are August through October, meaning that now is the time to have your hurricane preparations in place. As lan taught us, these monster storms can ravage a barrier island. Careful hurricane preparation can alleviate some of that anxiety while potentially saving you and your loved ones.

EVACUATE!

If the Lee County Emergency Management Office declares a voluntary or mandatory evacuation order for Fort Myers Beach, EVACUATE!

While you want to have on-hand all the necessities to ride out a hurricane in the comfort of your own home, being that we live on a barrier island that is in the primary Evacuation Zone A that can suffer everything from storm surge to wind damage to flash flooding and more, leave if the Lee County Emergency Operations Center declares an evacuation.

If your best option is a Lee County shelter, go but know upfront that it will have no creature comforts, so that should be your last option. You do not need to evacuate hundreds of miles away from FMB however to be safe; traveling as little as 15 miles so that you end up east of I-75 is generally a safe zone. Do not wait until the last minute to leave, as Lee County and FMB will close both island bridges when wind conditions dictate.

There is already a concern about hurricane evacuation complacency following Hurricane Milton in October 2024.

Forecasters predicted that Milton would bring devastation, so most Southwest Floridians wisely evacuated. Milton however gave FMB just a glancing blow rather than a direct hit, causing many to question if they really needed to



evacuate and they may not do so the next time Lee County leaders issue another notice. Follow the old adage of "Better Safe Than Sorry" & GO! We already lost too many good friends and neighbors to Ian.

AlterLee.com & CODE RED

Register at AlertLee.com for all emergency warnings, along with its app, LeePrepares. Pay attention not only to the area media outlets but various social media sites like the FMB Fire Department, the Town of FMB and the Lee County Emergency Management Office for instructions. In addition to AlertLee.com, sign up for the Town's CODE RED alert system at www.fortmyersbeachfl.gov that can provide you with information about bridge closures, evacuation notices and more safety issues. Remember that before, during, and after a hurricane, reputable social media sites can be your best friends, not only to provide you with valuable hurricane information but, equally as important, squashing untrue rumors.

FMB Hurricane Reentry Passes

If you already have a **GREEN** Reentry Pass from the prior hurricane season, you DO NOT need a new one for 2025. People who live, own property or manages a business in the Town can receive two Hurricane Re-Entry Passes. To obtain your Hurricane Re-Entry Passes, visit Town Hall at the Bay Oaks Recreational Center at 2731 Oak Street from

Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. You need one form of identification to receive your passes. If you are out-of-town, email hurricane@fmbgov.com with attached photographs and/or document files to prove your eligibility and include the address for where you want the Town to mail your passes. Should a hurricane strike in 2025, based on the storm's severity, FMB may close for up to 48 hours and possibly longer, until the Town, Lee County Sheriffs Office and FMB Fire District can certify the island's safety. For additional information, contact the Town at 239-765-0202 or email hurricane@fmbgov.com.

Special Needs Shelters

Lee County offers Special Needs Shelters for those with medical necessities, but you must register in advance every year at 239-533-0622 or through the "Emergency Management" page at www.lee.gov.com.

Hurricane Kit Essentials

Everyone should have a minimum supply of essentials to be self-sufficient for 72 to 96 hours, including for your pets. For a comprehensive list, see the FMB Fire Department's "Hurricane Preparedness Resources" link at www.fmbfirefl.gov.
